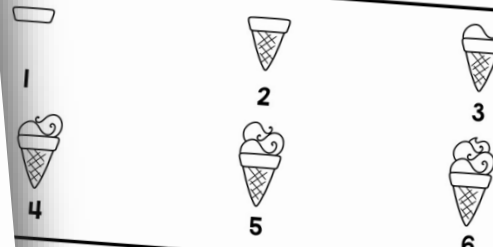
Sign Language "caterpillar"

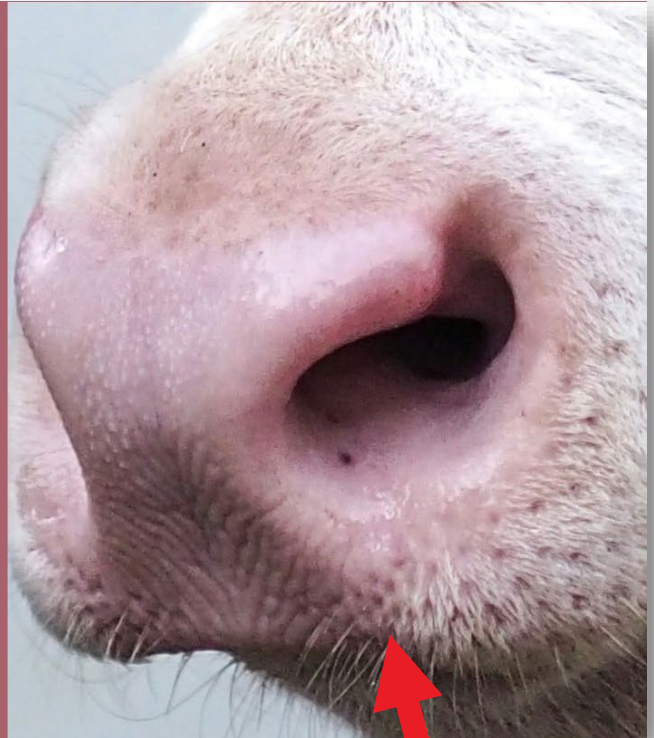
