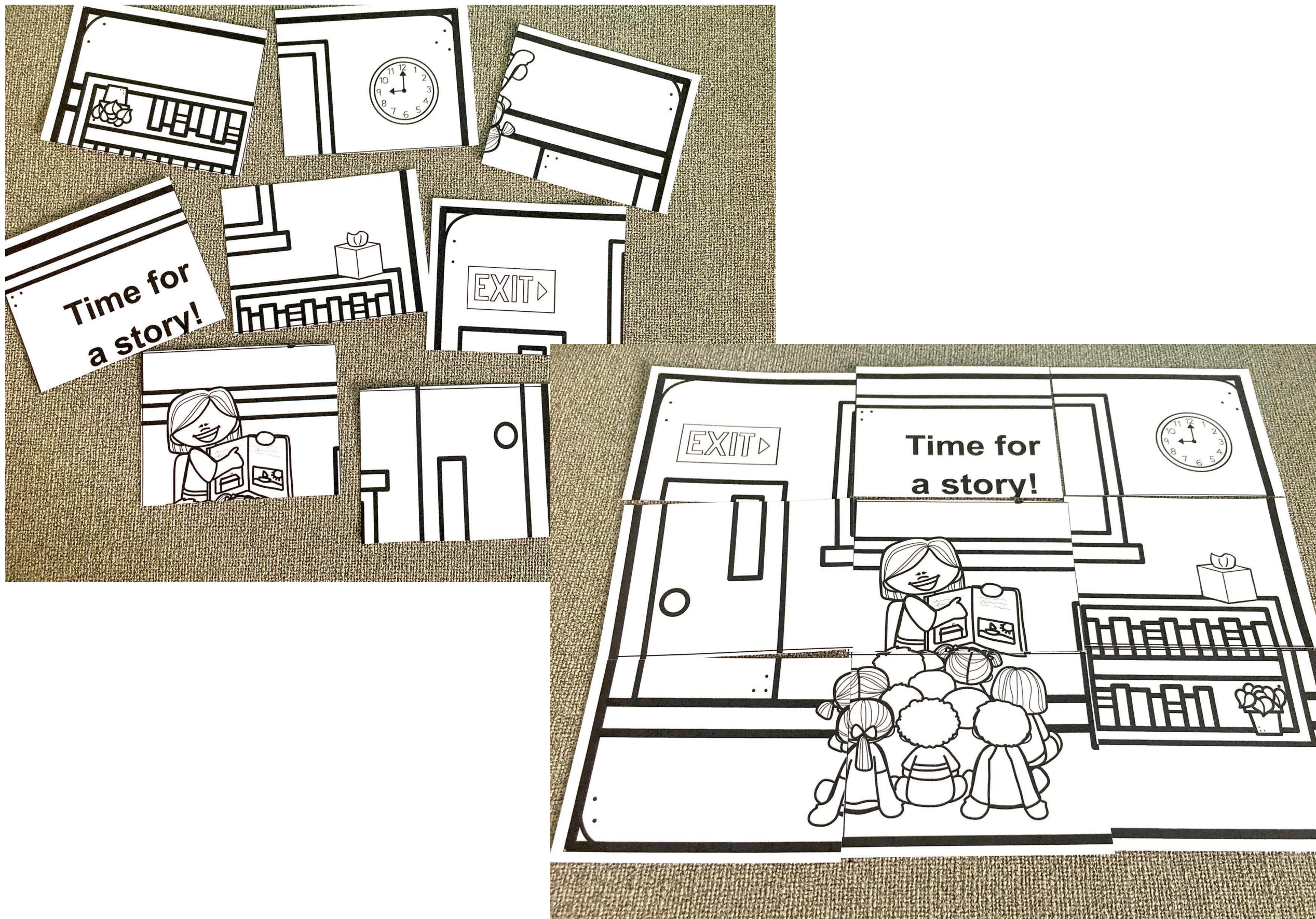
In groups of 2-3, students find the 9 locations in the library. At each location, they will find an envelope.

STEP TWO



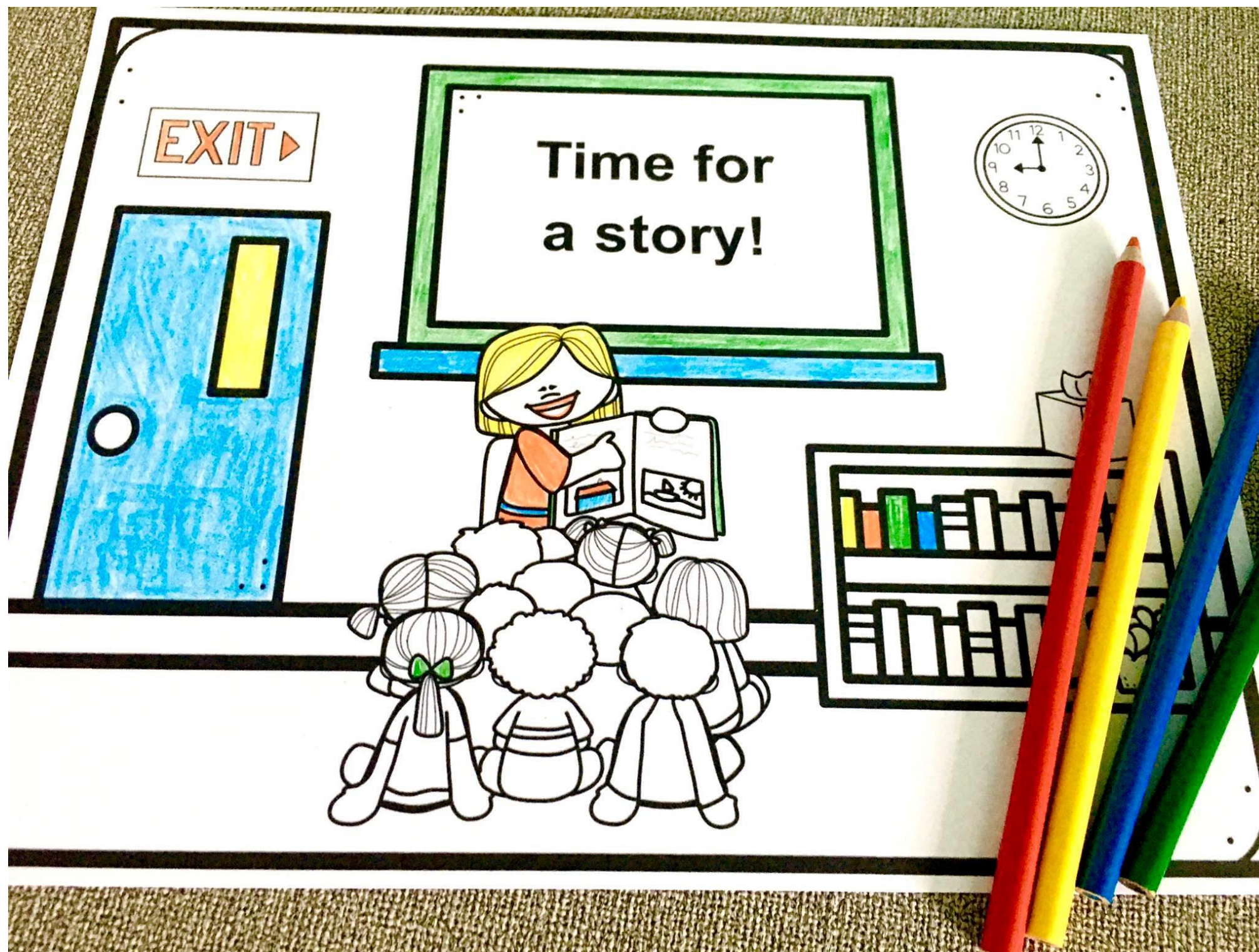
Students remove one piece of the puzzle from that location's envelope. They will put that one piece in their own envelope or bag.

STEP THREE



Once students have found all nine pieces,
they can assemble the puzzle.

STEP FOUR



Students show the librarian or teacher their assembled puzzle. They will get a “completed” puzzle to color when they are finished.

STEP FIVE

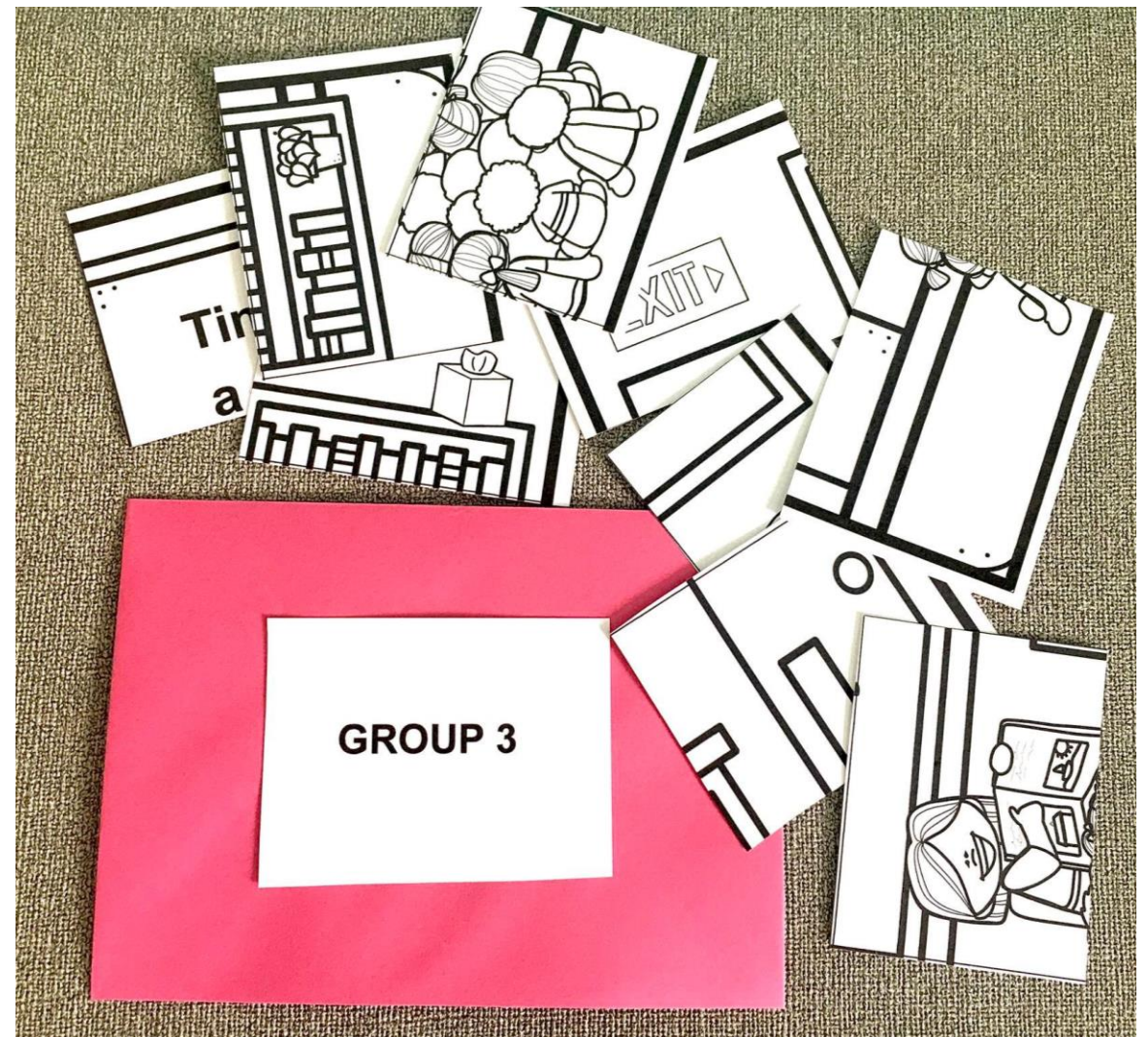


Before they color their “completed” puzzle page, students should sort their puzzle pieces in small baskets for each piece. This helps you have the pieces sorted for the next class.

WHAT'S EDITABLE

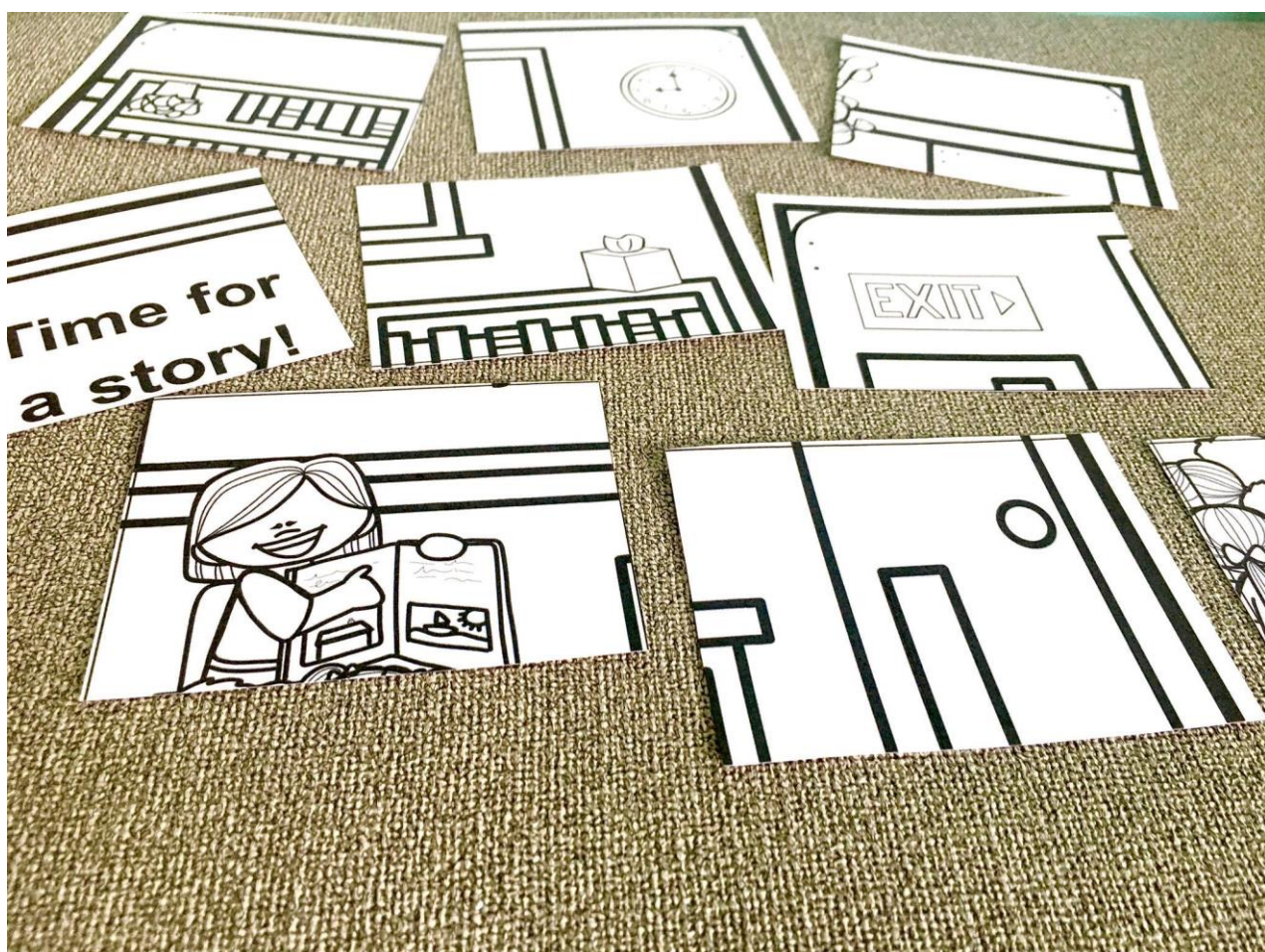
Editable:

- Text of scavenger hunt (you can change the locations)
- Blank scavenger hunt grid template (contains no images)
- Student directions
- Group labels



Not editable:

- Images on scavenger hunt (if you want to remove an image, just draw a white textbox over it)
- Puzzle pieces
- Coloring sheet

LESSON PLAN

Objective: In groups, students will find various locations in the library complete a scavenger hunt and put together a puzzle.

Materials: scavenger hunt grids, puzzle pieces, optional – clipboards
crayons/markers, completed puzzle to color

Procedure:

1. Divide students in groups of 2-3 students.
2. Give each group 1 empty envelope and 1 scavenger hunt grid. Crayon, marker, or pencil are optional.
3. Students find the locations on the scavenger hunt grid. Each take only one puzzle piece from the envelope and put it into the envelope with the puzzle pieces for that location.
4. When the groups have all 9 puzzle pieces in their envelopes show the librarian the completed puzzle, and they the black to color on their own.
5. Students should then sort their puzzle pieces into small baskets for the next class.
6. When finished, students get to color the puzzle (a whole puzzle).
7. Between classes, replace any torn or wrinkled puzzle pieces. Sort their puzzle pieces into small baskets or envelopes. Label the baskets or envelopes.

PREP INSTRUCTIONS

• What to print:

- "Let's Explore the Library" page – one per group X number of classes
– can be reused with other classes if laminated
- "Time for a Story" puzzle – choose to print in b&w or color, one per group

- "Time for a Story" puzzle – choose to print in b&w or color, one per group

TIPS

- Print the puzzle pieces on cardstock and/or laminate them to maximize durability.
- Color code the envelopes with the puzzle pieces. A "pink" group will get a pink location envelope. This may help prevent students from taking more than one puzzle piece for a location.
- Optional – Print each puzzle on different colored cardstock. This enables one group to take only the pink pieces and another group to take only the blue pieces.
- I do not recommend more than three students per group.
- Adjust the difficulty by hiding the envelopes in easier or more difficult places. For example, for "clock," hide the envelope right under the clock (easy) or somewhere near the clock (more difficult). For "plant," hide the envelope right next to the only plant in the library (easy), or hide it near any plant in the library (more difficult).
- If the grid contains a location that you do not have in your library, you can:
 - Type a new location in the textbox (editable) and keep the image the same
 - Stage that location just for this activity. For example, if you do not have a plant, borrow one for this activity.
 - If you cannot obtain a particular item, you can draw a white shape over the image and insert your own image.
- After groups assemble the puzzle and get their coloring sheet, let them sort their puzzle pieces into small baskets or envelopes. Label the baskets or envelopes.
